Other ideas to extend learning throughout the day:


- Ask your child questions about the books they are reading.

- Encourage your child to read their favorite books aloud to you, a sibling, or a stuffed toy.
- Ask everyday math problems like, "If we buy 3 boxes of juice boxes how many juice boxes will we have?"
- Encourage your child to make predictions and then evaluate what happened. Ask, "What do you think will happen if we

?" then ask, "What actually happened? Was it the same or different than your prediction?"


